REBUILDING THE WALLS OF JERUSALEM

Nehemiah 1:1 – 2:20

Key Verse 2:17

"Then I said to them, "You see the trouble we are in: Jerusalem lies in ruins, and its gates have been burned with fire. Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem, and we will no longer be in disgrace."

* Nehemiah's Prayer for Jerusalem (1:1-11)

- 1. When and what did Nehemiah learn about the situation of the Jews in Jerusalem? (1:1-3; Ezra 4:23; 6:15; 9:1-2) How did Nehemiah react to it, and what can we learn about him? (1-4) What did the broken wall of Jerusalem mean to the Jews? What may correspond with the broken walls of Jerusalem these days?
- 2. Consider the content of his prayer. How did Nehemiah acknowledge God in his prayer? (5) With what attitude did he pray to God? (6-7) What was the basis of his prayer? (8-9, Lev 26:33, Dt 30:4) How did he ask for the grace of God? (10-11)

* Nehemiah's act of faith for Jerusalem (2:1-20)

- 3. What did the King notice in Nehemiah? (1-2) Why was he "very much afraid"? What requests did he make to the king overcoming fear? (3-8, Es 4:12-16) How did God bless his venture of faith? (8)
- 4. What practical preparations did Nehemiah undertake upon his arrival? (11-16) What was Nehemiah's challenge to the leaders of Jerusalem and their reaction? (17-18) How did the enemies resist, and how did Nehemiah respond? (10,19,20) What are the qualities of spiritual leadership we learn from Nehemiah?
